#### CHANGES IN PREREGISTRATION PRIORITY

In choosing your Autumn 2006 courses, you should consider the following change, which has been voted on and approved by the faculty. Beginning with registration for Winter 2007, course resolution for General Education courses will give priority to 1st and 2nd year students above 3rd and 4th year students. (Priority will remain unchanged for other courses.) Therefore this cycle of selecting courses represents the last time current 2nd and 3rd year students will have priority for General Education courses. These students are advised to plan their choices accordingly.

#### AUTOMATIC REGISTRATION

Students currently enrolled in NTSC 10200 will be automatically registered for NTSC 10300 lecture and will be placed into an appropriate lab section during course resolution. Dropping this course during preregistration forfeits your seat in the course. If you drop this course by mistake, you should select and rank that same course. However, you are not guaranteed re-enrollment in the course, nor is the instructor obligated to sign a Registration Consent Form if the dropped course reaches capacity before you attempt to re-enroll.

#### CONSENT COURSES

Some courses require the consent of the instructor. You may select and rank these courses, but your preferences will not be resolved into course registration until you submit a signed Registration Consent Form to the registrar, beginning September 25.

#### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Note that registration for physical education courses will begin online on September 25.
